Life becomes harder when a family struggles with something as fundamental as housing. Housing insecurity affects more than just shelter – it disrupts every aspect of life, from meeting daily needs like groceries and childcare to achieving long-term goals such as saving, education, and career advancement.

For families in survival mode, priorities shift to working more hours and cutting essentials just to cover bills. Activities like after-school sports, higher education, and building savings – things many take for granted – become unattainable luxuries. The stress of constantly meeting basic needs leaves little room for planning or pursuing opportunities.

Affordable housing changes this dynamic. It provides families with stability, allowing them to focus on growth rather than survival. Stable housing improves health, enhances children’s academic performance, and fosters economic security. Families can budget without fear of rent increases or frequent moves, bringing opportunities that extend far beyond the home itself.

This stability empowers parents to invest in their own education or careers, creating brighter futures for their children. Research shows children in stable homes have better access to education, participate more in extracurricular activities, and are more likely to graduate and pursue higher education – setting them up for long-term success.

Yet, in Collier County, affordable housing remains a critical challenge. Nearly a third of households spend over 30% of their income on housing, a burden that affects families, our workforce, and the community’s overall well-being. Addressing this shortage is essential to preserving the Collier County we love.

This year, we celebrate the incredible impact of your support. Thanks to your generosity, 92 families achieved strength and stability through homeownership in fiscal year 2024. Together, we look forward to welcoming even more families home in the year ahead.

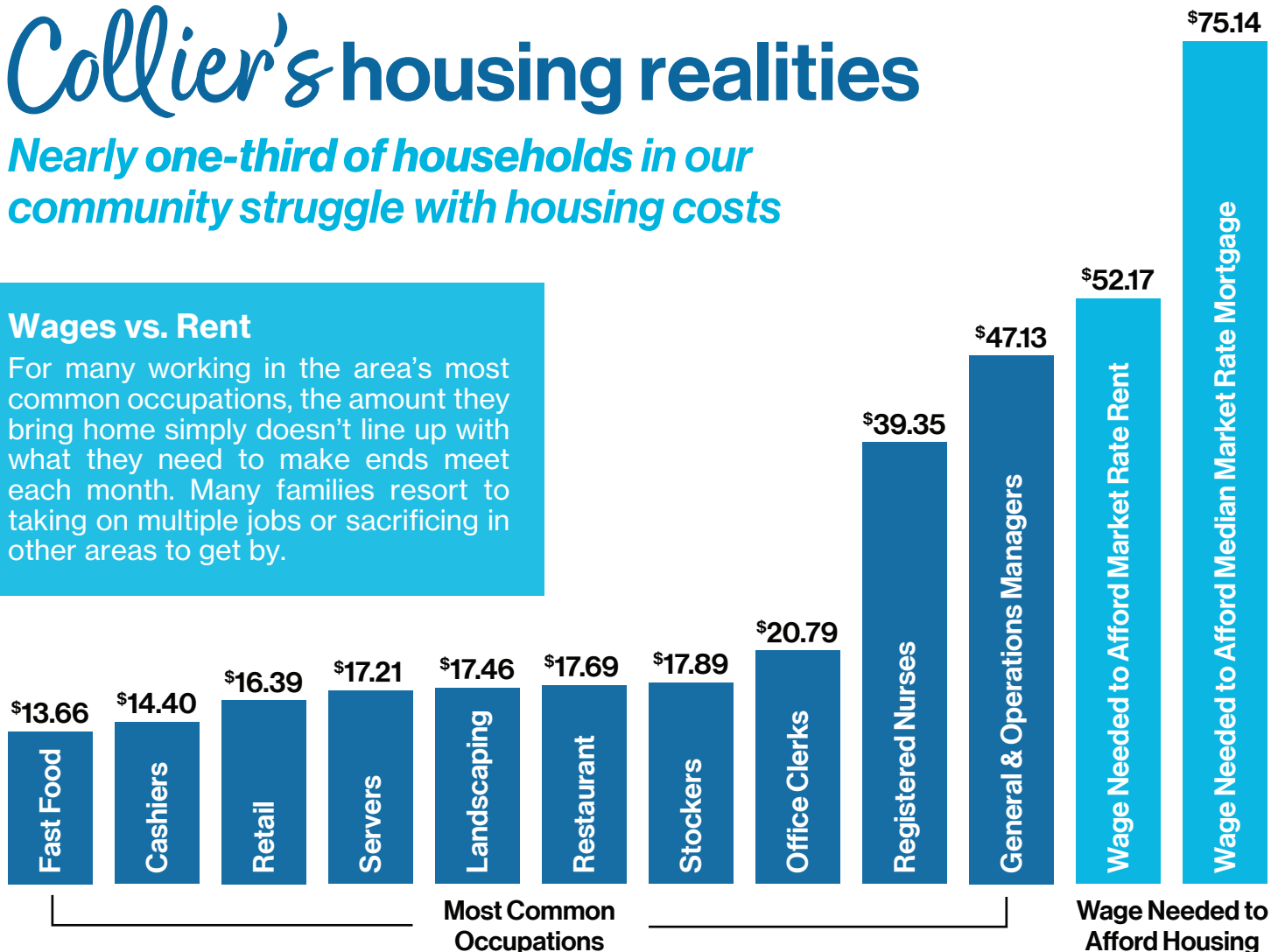

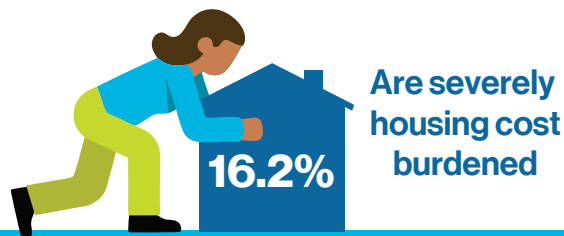
Nearly one-third of households in our community struggle with housing costs

Made Possible: Generational Stability

With so many new residents and costs rising as a result of the increased demand for housing, we're seeing more and more of those who have called this community home for generations forced to consider moving away from everything and everyone they've ever known.





In Collier County, the median home price has surged to over \$600,000. That means that essential workers are finding it nearly impossible to afford a place to live. With the cost-of-living outpacing wages, now families who have called this community home for generations are being priced out of it. The housing crisis is no longer just a statistic—it's affecting the very people who shape the future of our community.

Rachel, a dedicated preschool teacher and fifth-generation Collier County native, knows this reality all too well. As an educator, her contributions help shape young minds and nurture the next generation of Collier County residents. But for years, Rachel struggled to provide her own family with the stability she works hard to create for her students.

their family has lived for generations, a place that has always been home. Now, Rachel can provide the stability her son needs to thrive.

Rachel's story underscores the challenge so many workers in Collier County face. They are the backbone of our community, yet many are finding it increasingly difficult to remain here and live where they work. Without affordable housing solutions, we risk losing these critical contributors.

Thanks to her partnership with Habitat Collier, Rachel's story has a different ending, made possible by every volunteer, donor, and advocate who supports and promotes this mission. You made it possible for her family to stay in the community

Before partnering with Habitat Collier, Rachel and her son, Myron, were living in a cramped one-bedroom apartment. As a single mom, keeping up with rising housing costs in the county was a constant challenge, even with steady and stable employment. Rachel and Myron shared the apartment's only bedroom, his lofted twin bed giving just enough space for a homework desk underneath while Rachel slept in an adjacent twin bed. In late 2022, Hurricane Ian damaged their apartment, forcing them to relocate yet again. Rachel found herself navigating displacement, financial stress, and the desire to provide stability for her son.

Rachel's commitment to her son, her students, and her community has never wavered. She has worked tirelessly to provide a better life, determined to persevere. In April, her dream became a reality when she closed on her Habitat home.

For Rachel and Myron, the move to their new home is more than just a change in address. It's a chance to strengthen their deep roots in the community where

Made Possible: Whitaker Woods





As National Homeownership Month came to a close in June, we celebrated a major milestone—the completion of Whitaker Woods. This community now provides a safe, stable, and affordable place to live for 125 grateful families.

The final home closings were a culmination of months of hard work by the new homeowners, who put in countless hours on the job site and completed pre-purchase education courses as part of their Habitat journey. These families now have the stability and security of homeownership.

Juan, Joanna, and their two children were one of the final families to purchase their home, filled with gratitude and emotion as they signed their closing documents. After losing their rental unit because their landlord wouldn't complete necessary maintenance, they were forced into cramped living conditions with extended family. Now, through their partnership with Habitat, they are finally able to have a home of their own.

In July, Whitaker Woods officially established their own community association, electing board members from amongst its residents to manage and guide the future of the neighborhood. Habitat worked closely with the new homeowners to ensure a smooth transition, setting them up for success as they maintain their homes and build a thriving community for future generations.

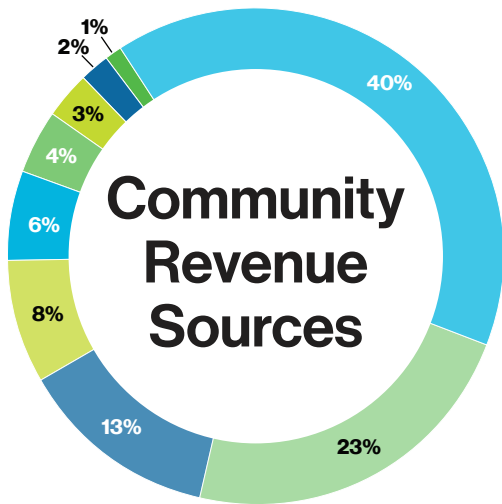

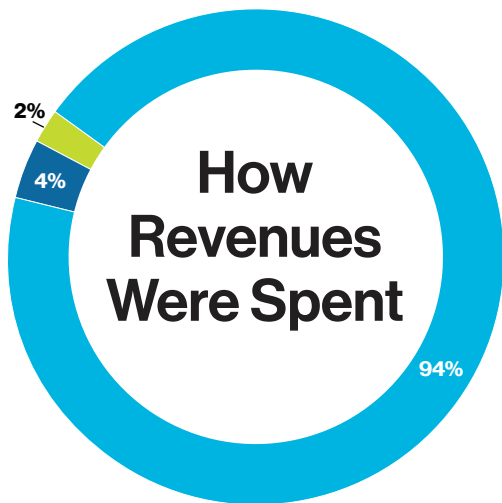

Making it Possible:

Majestic Place





Last spring, construction began at our next Naples subdivision, Majestic Place! This new community is located adjacent to Habitat's existing Regal Acres subdivision, which was completed in 2015. Naples families applying to partner with us today will be building their homes in Majestic Place, and we expect construction to continue in this subdivision for about two years. When completed, there will be a total of 109 new homes in this neighborhood – and 109 new opportunities for affordable homeownership!

The Cost of Home

This community is a great example of both our work to sustain future initiatives as well as the challenges we face as a nonprofit builder. The property for this subdivision has been in our land bank since 2018. At the time, estimates for preparing that raw land for construction – clearing, fill, roadwork, sewer and electrical infrastructure – were coming in at \$4 million. Knowing it would be several years before we would begin construction, we budgeted \$8 million for these costs. In 2023 when we were finally ready to break ground, we learned that rising costs had outpaced our forecasted budget, with the lowest bids coming in at \$12 million. While we make efforts to lock in prices for raw land years before breaking ground on a community, escalating infrastructure costs can be incredibly difficult to predict. This is why your support and advocacy for this work is so critical to our mission and making sure we are able to fund future communities in a constantly changing landscape.

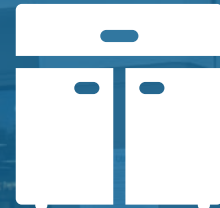

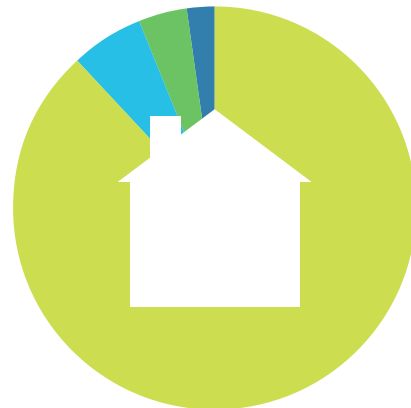
